#### Process to identify material IROs:

- Matters: Pollution of air, water and soil and substances of concern
- **Outcome** of pollution materiality assessment:
  - List of site locations
  - List of business activities
- To be considered:
  - LEAP approach around Location, Evaluation, Assessment, Prepare
  - Value chain and lifecycle assessment
  - Physical and transition risks, opportunities

\* SFDR PAI = mandatory

## Policies, Actions and resources

Whether and how adopted around the mitigation hierarchy:

 Avoid pollution, incidents and

> emergencies, phase out substances of very high concern, especially for non-essential uses

- Reduce pollution,
  Minimise and substitute substances of concern
- Mitigate negative impacts, restore, regenerate, and transform ecosystem

#### Metrics and targets

Targets whether and how adopted, linked to material metrics, ecological thresholds

#### Metrics

•

- Pollution air, water and soil
  - emissions of air pollutants\*
  - emissions to water\*
  - emissions of inorganic pollutants\*
  - emissions of ozone-depleting substances\*
  - microplastics generated or used
- SoCs and SVHCs
- Potential financial effects
  - Quantitative unless impracticable
  - Share of SoC/SVHCrelated revenue
  - CapEx/OpEx related to incidents & deposits
  - Environmental provisions
